Judiciary Budget for State Fiscal Year 2013-2014

The Legislature adopted a Unified Court System Budget of \$2.55 billion. This reflects a cash increase of 44.2 million, as well as an additional \$5 million allocation to create 20 new Family Court judgeships in 2015. The overall Judiciary budget increase was 3.6%.

Makes technical correction relating to exercise of power of appointment and an authorized trustee's authority to invade trust principle.

4. Chapter 202 of the Laws of 2014 – S.5212-A Flanagan/A.7641-A DenDekker

Relates to sprinkler system notice in residential leases.

5. Chapter 314 of the Laws of 2014 – S.7143 Bonacic/A.9314 Weinstein

Relates to business records of non-parties.

6. Chapter 315 of the Laws of 2014 – S.7144 Bonacic/A.9355-A Santabarbara

Relates to renunciation of property interests.

7. Chapter 356 of the Laws of 2014 – S.3479-A Golden/A.1582-A Lentol

Prevents referees from being held liable for interest or penalties on transfer taxes to be paid on deeds filed in their capacity as referee.

8. Chapter 371 of the Laws of 2014 - S.5073 Bonacic/A.9075 Steck

Relates to the want of prosecution.

9. Chapter 379 of the Laws of 2014 – S.5077 Bonacic/A.9077 Weinstein

Relates to conduct of the examination before trial.

10. Chapter 380 of the Laws of 2014 – S.5372-A Bonacic/A.9762 Titus

Relates to an affirmation by any person in a civil action.

11. Chapter 391 of the Laws of 2014 – S.7077-A Bonacic/A.9759 Weinstein

Relates to powers of attorney in relation to decedents' estates required to be in writing and recorded.

12. Chapter 404 of the Laws of 2014 – S.4952 Bonacic/A.1185 Weinstein

Establishes the formula for determining the interest payable on a delayed legacy; repealer.

13. Chapter 439 of the Laws of 2014 – S. 4779-B Bonacic/A.7461-A Cook

Relates to inheritance by children conceived after the death of a genetic parent.
